21	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of South
22	Carolina:
23 24	SECTION 1 Section 14.7.1720 of the 1076 Code on last
25	SECTION 1. Section 14-7-1730 of the 1976 Code, as last
26	amended by Act 335 of 1992, is further amended to read:
27	"Section 14-7-1730. (A) Except for the prosecution of cases
28	arising from indictments issued by the state grand jury, the
29	presiding judge has jurisdiction to hear all matters arising from the
30	proceedings of a state grand jury, including, but not limited to,
31	matters relating to the impanelment or removal of state grand
32	jurors, the quashing of subpoenas, the punishment for contempt,
33	and the matter of bail for persons indicted by a state grand jury.
34	(B) A person indicted by a state grand jury for a bailable
35	offense must have a bond hearing within twenty-four hours of his
36	arrest and must be released within a reasonable time, not to exceed
37	four hours, after the bond is delivered to the incarcerating facility."

39	SECTION 2. This act takes effect upon approval by the Governor.
